DePaul, a Rochester-based not-for-profit organization, renovated the former school building, which had been closed since 2002. The \$20 million project, which received city, state and private funding, salvaged much of the building's original architecture in

The floor from the old gymnasium, chalkboards and granite from the school's bathrooms were reused and incorporated in the interior design of the complex, which also includes antique items donated by former employees, students and teachers.
